TERMS & CONDITIONS

1. Date & Location of Show

The Show will be held on Tuesday, 13th and Wednesday, 14th of August 2024 on Anglesey County Showground, Gwalchmai, LL65 4RW.

2. Cancellation of Classes and/or Entries

Anglesey Agricultural Society reserves the right to cancel or amalgamate any classes or sections if deemed appropriate. Exhibitors already entered will be offered entry into an alternative section where appropriate or the entry fee may be returned to each exhibitor after the show dates. This is the only circumstance in which refunds will be issued.

Any class entry/entries confirms that the exhibitor accepts the Society's terms and conditions.

All exhibitors enter at their own risk and the Society accepts no liability whatsoever.

3. <u>Tickets and passes</u>

Upon receipt of tickets and passes, exhibitors are requested to check immediately that their allocation is correct. No duplicate tickets or passes will be issued.

Passes will be sent in advance to enable access through the Equine (red) entrance and the vehicle pass must be displayed on the front of your vehicle.

Officials and Stewards reserve the right to inspect all vehicles on arrival at the Showground.

4. Stewards

No steward or show official, whilst competing at the show, shall wear any rosette or badge when they enter the ring.

5. Dress Code

All exhibitors/handlers should ensure they are wearing appropriate show clothing and footwear required to enter the designated show rings.

6. Public liability

All exhibitors, without exception, must have public liability/third party insurance.

7. Health & Safety

The organisers of this event have taken reasonable precautions to ensure the health & safety of everyone present. For these measures to be effective, everyone must take reasonable precautions to prevent accidents occurring and must obey the instructions of the organisers, officials and stewards. Please ensure that all animals are show trained and that all show equipment is in good condition.

8. <u>Animal Welfare</u>

Anglesey Agricultural Society is very keen to ensure the health and welfare of all livestock that attend the events that the Society organises. Show organisers have an obligation (under the terms of the Animal Welfare Act 2006 Section 9(2)) to ensure that the best welfare practices are observed at all times and this also assists in the prevention of the spread of animal diseases. This involves working within the regulations and guidelines set out by government organisations, and developing policies and procedures that can be compiled with by the Society's representatives e.g., staff and voluntary workers, exhibitors and the general public. The Welfare Plan has been drawn up with the assistance of the Society's appointed veterinary surgeons, Bodrwnsiwn Vets, and demonstrates that due consideration has been given to all aspects of animal health and welfare. The plan is available for inspection by the animal health authorities if required. The society is keen to promote equine welfare and as part of this, we encourage all riders to be aware of appropriate size and weight for the horse/pony being ridden.

9. GDPR and Data Protection Act 1998

The Society rules regarding the above are currently in accordance with the Data Protection Act 1998. To enable the Society to deliver its services to you, there is a need for you to continue providing personal data. With GDPR the security of your personal data is of paramount importance to the Society. The Society has developed a Privacy Policy which can be found on our website. It sets out detailed information regarding personal information, how we use it, for what purpose and the legal basis for doing so. 10. Awarding of cups and trophies

Information of cups and trophies to be awarded to particular sections are included within the schedule. Unfortunately, some trophies previously won were not returned by the recipients to the Show Office, and therefore, may not be presented at this year's Show. The Society is working across all sections to try and recover all outstanding cups/trophies.

<u>11.</u> Protests

Any person may submit a protest.

All protests shall be made in writing to the Show Secretary within one hour of completion of the relevant class.

All protests must be accompanied by a deposit of ± 30 . If the protest is substantiated, it shall be returned to the complainant. If unsubstantiated, the deposit to be forfeited to the Society.

12. Hearing of Protests

If necessary, a meeting of the Council shall be convened within fourteen days of the second day of the Show to receive the reports of the Veterinary Surgeon and Stewards and to hear protests. Their decision thereon shall be final. No prize money shall be paid before the expiration of a period of fourteen days.

GENERAL CONDITIONS FOR EQUINE EXHIBITORS

1. HEALTH AND SAFETY

a) ACCESS TO COLLECTING RING AREAS

To comply with Health and Safety Executive guidelines, the Society has created collecting rings and specific routes to those rings. It is a condition of entry that all exhibits keep within these designated routes, that all reasonable precautions are taken to prevent accidents and that guidance is taken from Officials or Stewards at any crossing points etc. All horses MUST walk within the Horse Walks, Collecting Rings and into the Judging Rings. The use of aids such as plastic bags, plastic bottles containing stones etc. inside are not permitted in these areas and will not be tolerated by the Show. Access to the Horse Walk is by horse exhibitors only. No pushchairs or dogs will be allowed access to these areas. In the interest of safety, any pedestrian crossings of the Horse Walk will be manned by crossing stewards.

b) SAFETY HEADGEAR

It is a mandatory requirement that all riders including judges MUST wear a hat manufactured to British Standard specification appropriate to the relevant Section/Society in which they are exhibiting/competing with the chinstrap fastened correctly & securely at all times whilst mounted anywhere on the Showground.

The Equine prize money scale is as follows: -

All prize money will be paid directly to exhibitors by the Society following the Show. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that the correct bank details are provided when entering to ensure that prize money is paid. If bank details are not provided when entering, prize money will regrettably not be paid.

4. ARRIVAL & DEPARTURE OF HORSES & PONIES

Equine exhibitors should use the RED GATE to enter the Showground on both days. Access will be restricted, and all occupants of vehicles must hold the correct passes and admission ticket(s). Vehicles which do not have an Equine Exhibitor Vehicle Pass will not be allowed into the Equine Parking Area. Additional admission tickets to the showground may be purchased on the gate.

5. STABLE ACCOMMODATION & FACILITIES

Unfortunately, there are no on-site stables available. Should you wish for your exhibits to be stabled locally for the duration of the Show, please get in touch with the Show Office who may be able to provide details of local stabling.

6. HORSE PASSPORTS & BREED REGISTRATION

The Equine Identification (Wales) Regulations 2018 require all horse owners to obtain a passport for each animal they own. Horse exhibitors should ensure that they are in receipt of the necessary passports for all horses and/or ponies they are exhibiting at the show and have them available for inspection if requested by a statutory body. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to ensure that all horses and ponies they are entering are registered with the necessary breed society or organisation prior to the show. Registration numbers must be quoted on the entry form.

7. MARES WITH FOAL AT FOOT

Wherever, in accordance with a class definition or regulation, a mare is to be shown "with foal at foot", this declaration shall be deemed to certify that the foal shown IS the progeny of the mare with which it is shown.

8. FOALS

All foals entered must be at least 3 weeks of age at the date of the Show.

9. MEASURING OF HORSES

Exhibitors of animals registered with recognised Breed or Show Societies, which has a requirement as to height, must be able to produce a certificate issued by the Joint Measurement Board if required to do so.

10. JUDGES INTEREST IN EXHIBITS

Exhibitors are not permitted to enter any animals in any classes which is to be judged by a person who has/had a financial interest in the animals, or which have stood in his/her yard. Stud fees are not considered to be a financial gain. The onus of complying with this rule rests entirely with the exhibitor.

11. EQUINE HANDLERS

All handlers must be a minimum of 14 years old on the first day of the show for the judging of all inhand equine classes (apart from young handler classes) and to lead a horse/pony on the horse walk and for the Main Ring Parades. All handlers of stallions, either in hand or ridden, must be over the age of 16 years.

12. MAIN RING PARADE

The first three prize-winners in each class MUST participate in the Main Ring Parade on the day of competing or will forfeit his/her prize money. Other prize winners have the option to parade. Parade cards must be handed by exhibitors to a steward on entry to the Main Ring Parade.

If an exhibitor feels he/she has a valid reason for not participating in the Main Ring Parade, he/she MUST present a written explanation outlining the reason for not parading to the show office prior to the Parade commencing. This will then be considered by show officials.

13. FALL of HORSE, PONY or RIDER

A fall of a horse, pony or rider in any class will result in elimination. The rider must not remount in the ring and should see a medically qualified attendant before remounting.

14. SHOW LIVERIES

Please use a separate entry form for each owner. All horses or ponies that are show produced MUST be entered in the name of the owner. The contact address can remain that of the producer/show livery yard.

15. EQUINE INFLUENZA VACCINATIONS

Although not mandatory, equine influenza and tetanus vaccinations are highly recommended for all horses attending the Anglesey County Show.

16. SECTION/CLASS ENTRIES

Please note that details of the number of entries in each section/class will NOT be divulged prior to the show day.

2. The winner of the Special Prize must be a member of the Shire Horse Society.

3. Entries cannot be accepted at Affiliated Shows in classes for Shires or Heavy Horses from any person who has been either suspended or removed from membership of the Shire Horse Society or has been excluded from exhibiting for prizes at Shows, Sales or Exhibitions or from taking part in any Show organised by the Shire Horse Society.

4. No animal to be eligible to take more than one Silver Spoon during any one year. The Shire Horse Society National Shire Horse Show being excepted.

5. THE WINNING ANIMAL MUST BE REGISTERED OR ELIGIBLE FOR REGISTRATION IN THE STUD BOOK OR GRADE B REGISTER.

6. The Judge invited to officiate must be on the Society's Official Panel and has the right to withhold the award of the Silver Spoon and Rosette if an exhibit does not show sufficient merit.
